Dear Program Representative:

The California Board of Registered Nursing (Board), at its Board meeting on November 20-21, 2024, agendized the following item:

8.6 Discussion and possible action regarding acceptance of a feasibility study for new prelicensure programs (16 CCR §1421).

The Board voted to accept the feasibility study of the new prelicensure program requested by Southern California Health Institute Associate Degree Nursing Program with an enrollment pattern of: 24 students three (3) times a year for an annual enrollment of 72 students.

Please review the information below to ensure timely completion of the initial prelicensure program approval process:

- When a proposed program is in the Feasibility Study (FS) development phase, the school is advised to start a projected 1-year time frame from anticipated Board acceptance of the FS to first enrollment/admission of program students, to allow ample time to secure all required program resources prior to opening. Programs will not be prohibited from opening earlier if all requirements are met and Board approval is granted.
- When more than one year has elapsed from the time of Board acceptance of the FS to acceptance of the Self-Study and/or admission of students, the program will provide information as requested by the NEC for re-evaluation and verification of continuing availability of adequate clinical placement and other required program resources.
- Proposed programs that have not submitted an acceptable Self-Study at least 6 months prior to the proposed date for enrollment of students (Title 16, California Code of Regulations (CCR) section 1421(a)(4)), as stated in the FS accepted by the Board, will be required to begin the new program application process at step one (submission of a Letter of Intent).

Southern California Health Institute must receive initial program approval from the Board and begin student enrollment no later than November 2026.

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Please submit the name of program director to the Board pursuant to Title 16, CCR section 1421(a)(3) and as described in Step 6 Appointment of Program Director in the document, "Instructions for Institutions Seeking Approval of New Prelicensure Registered Nursing Program."
